The CENTER announces the following developments as accomplished:

A national newspaper is providing a continuing quarterly donation for secretarial assistance.

A substantial number of internationally known scientists in a variety of fields have offered their services to the CENTER.

Two university computer staff directors have been devoting considerable time to cataloging UFO reports. A partial analysis of these reports has been prepared and the results will be released through the CENTER. Their facilities have been offered to the CENTER for other studies also.

The staff members of two atomic research laboratories have offered the CENTER their cooperation in the analysis of any physical properties which relate to UFOs or their landing areas.

An arrangement has been made whereby the CENTER has the use of a toll-free telephone number for the reporting of significant events by law enforcement and other responsible agencies throughout the U.S.

Letters have been mailed to several thousand police departments advising them of the CENTER's existence and giving them guidelines for the use of the toll-free number.

A new UFO sighting report form has been produced and is now available to be sent to UFO witnesses.

As a result of international press publicity and letters to those who have inquired about the CENTER, donations are coming in from far and near. An especially fine contribution came from a woman in Paris France, as a result of press coverage.

The following are in the process of being developed:

A documentary film, to be produced this summer featuring the CENTER and its work. The sponsor, director and "cast" have already been determined, and the narrator will be a well known TV figure. Prime UFO sightings and encounters will be re-enacted and the film is to be shown this fall.

Brochures, describing the origin, operation and objectives of the CENTER, to be produced and distributed to philanthropic and industrial organizations in the near future.

A quarterly journal, to make the CENTER's findings available to the public. Present plans are to issue a statistical evaluation of the more than 1500 sightings and encounters reported during 1973.

A series of concerts by well known personalities who have volunteered their talents to raise funds.

Dissemination of the toll-free number to all police departments not included in the previous mailing, and also to aviation and civil defense authorities.

And finally, the CENTER sees these improvements in the near future:

A central office location where all the existing UFO material presently in the possession of the principals of the CENTER can be consolidated and organized. This office will also contain the administrative, editorial, public relations, library and sales activities. Documents, reports, books and other UFO materials may be purchased here.

An international symposium is to be established on an annual basis. This is under discussion by scientists throughout the world who have turned to the CENTER for its organization and sponsorship.
